## **Guidelines**

- 1) Submit written, visual, audio, or mixmedia works.
- 2) Follow one, or many, of our three keywords:
  LOVE, SUBVERSION, PERCEPTION

We are looking for works of various forms that engage in one way or another with these themes, building from them or wrecking them. These themes are open to question and interpretation, we want to hear your take on them.

- 3) For written works: submit your original piece in a Word document with Helvetica font, 12 pts, 1.5 spacing, and 1-inch margins, justified.
- 4) For all works: include both an English and French short abstract (max 200 words), 3 to 5 keywords, and a brief acknowledgments section.
- 5) References should follow the Chicago Manual of Style, Author-Date format, with in-text citations, a reference list, and footnotes (if applicable).
